

TITLE

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE PURPOSE OF AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE AND SAFETY TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND ENTER INTO CONTRACT(S) PROVIDING FOR THE CUSTODIAL AND CLEANING SERVICES FOR VARIOUS CITY BUILDINGS AND DEPARTMENTS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

ORDINANCE NO. 12704/17

WHEREAS, cleaning and custodial services are needed to insure availability to the various departments to meet their needs for the services that they provide to the residents of the City of Warren; NOW THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Warren, State of Ohio:

Section 1: That the Director of Public Service and Safety be, and hereby is, authorized to advertise for bids and enter into a contract(s) according to law for the custodial and cleaning services of various City buildings and departments within the City of Warren.

Section 2: That said contract(s) shall be for a term of one (1) year, with said contract to include an annual rate increase, if any, to be based upon the Regional Consumer Price Index. However, a Regional Consumer Price Index increase in any one year shall not exceed 2.5%.

Section 3: That the funds for said contracted services will be paid from Account No. 100-304-5315 Contracted Services.

Section 4: That the contract(s) shall first be approved by the Law Director, and the City Auditor be, and hereby is, authorized to disburse said funds upon receipt of proper vouchers, signed by the proper persons, for the stated purpose and for no other purpose.

Section 5: That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, welfare and safety, and for the further reason to meet the current contract termination date without undue delay. WHEREFORE, this Ordinance shall go into immediate effect.
