The Business of Love

Jolies Femmes sells sexy lingerie, Shirley's Sweet Spot has vintage-inspired candy, Gene's Jewelers and Thom Duma Fine Jewelers will cover all of your sparkly needs.

Both Thom Duma's (TDFJ) and Gene's have been staples of the downtown area for decades. Although both offer dazzling engagement rings and other fine jewelry, their stores are distinctly different. Gene's has an eclectic mix of fashion and estate jewelry as well as other unique gifts— hand-painted wine glasses, modern cukoo clocks, purses and more. TDFJ's primarily offers luxury brands, although jewelry starts with price-points as low as \$30. They specialize in bridal and fashion jewelry, as well as watches for men and women.

Thom Duma's is a household name in the Valley, due to the sought-after luxury brands at the store and their successful ongoing advertising efforts. Owner Tom Duma, Jr. attributes his business acumen to his father. Thom, Sr., who bought the business in 1957, which was then named Klivans. The first year Thom, Sr. operated the business he insisted on costly renovations and a heavy advertising campaign, although already in debt from

the purchase of the store. In a year's time, store revenue increased by \$60k (which was quite a lot of money in the late 50s). The business has been a success ever since. Tom, Jr. learned the business from the ground up, and when he took the reins from his father he remodeled the store once more. He also changed the name of the store: Thom Duma's Fine Jewelers, in honor of his dad.

Duma's first rule in business is to break all the rules. The company offers a free bridal warranty on rings, one of the only companies in the marketplace to do so.


THINK- Not Another ART Show: An Exploration of DaDa



What is the Garden District?



The Garden District is a collaborative effort to revitalize Warren's oldest neighborhood. Trumbull Neighborhood Partnership (TNP), gregg's gardens, Trumbull 100 and others have partnered with residents to redevelop this 22 block area that overlaps with the downtown Central Business District, through strategic demolition, creative land use and placemaking, public art and community events, and housing renovations. The project is supported by the Trumbull County Land Bank and has been successful in leveraging both public and private support.

This summer, TNP will partner with The Robins Project, and students from The New School in NYC and Kent State University to create design interventions in the overlapping districts, to create a more vibrant place to live in Warren.
